These school classes were held each Thursday evening. This Program was opened by all students singing the Hymn "WHEN HIS FACE I SEE." The singing was led by Mike Downs.

Prayer was then led by Miss Gladys Orr of Southern California. She is a recent graduate of Glad Tidings.

An offering was taken for Pastor Offiler, as a love gift to the Dean of the School.

Introduction, by Mike Downs, of Pastor Van Dalen, teacher of the Holland Dutch language. His class will sing in the Dutch language, "JESUS PAID IT ALL."

Next will be a skit by the Foreign Missions Class. Beryl Busby is the teacher of this class.

A short talk on Foreign Missions by Elizabeth Arndt. Her subject, "THE DARKNESS OF SIN IN THE WORLD." "God's plan of redemption is the way out, bought with the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. We, who have known Jesus, have not been faithful. We must tell the story of Jesus and be about our Father's business and reach those souls who will perish if we neglect to do the work of God.

There were two classes of Junior boys. It grew until when we left there were almost 100 in the classes.
